

The Colene Drace Cell Biology Award

Created in 2002 by Texas State graduate Colene Drace, this award recognizes exceptional research in cell biology by a Department of Biology graduate student.

- Biology students in any sub-discipline are eligible as long as their work involves techniques of cell and molecular biology.
- Current graduate student who completed a thesis-requiring Master's degree or Ph.D. degree in the Department of Biology during the current academic year.
- Must have an approved thesis or dissertation proposal on file with the Graduate Dean.
- Must not be on conditional status or academic probation.
- Complete and submit the Nomination Form at <http://147.26.168.11/CBio/CDCBR.nclk>
- Prior to the deadline, the nominator must provide to the CDCBA committee:
 - a cover letter that specifically addresses the criteria above and describes how the nominee clearly exceeds or exceeded minimal expectations of all graduate students.
 - One to three letters of support for the nominee, one of which should be from the nominee's mentor.
- These materials should be prepared on appropriate letterhead or stationery and should be delivered to Dr. Joseph Koke, Interim Chair, Department of Biology.
- Deadline: March 23, 2007
